

Meet the Artist

Elizabeth Parry-Faist is a photographer and mixed media artist from Factoryville, Pennsylvania. She uses a variety of materials to explore both works on paper and three-dimensional pieces. In 2004, she became a rostered artist with the Pennsylvania Council on the Arts and the Northeastern Educational Intermediate Unit (NEIU 19). Throughout her 14-year career as a rostered artist, she has taken part in more than 90 artist residencies. In 2005, she was awarded Arts in Education, "Artist of the Year" by the NEIU 19. Parry-Faist has been a presenter in trainings and professional development across the state of Pennsylvania. She received her MFA from the University of Connecticut and her BFA from the University of Rhode Island. In 2016, she completed a certificate program from the National Center for Creative Aging online artist training. In 2017, Parry-Faist received her Teaching Artist Certificate at the University of the Arts in Philadelphia.


